

# The Mirror of the Martyrs

This traveling exhibit, based on illustrated martyr stories from the 1685 *Martyrs Mirror*, tells in fresh ways how martyrs past and present have witnessed to their faith under oppression and persecution.

*The Martyrs Mirror Trust* invites families, Sunday school classes, senior citizen groups, and others to come see this very special, very important exhibit!

**This display emphasizes dialogue!**

Questions are woven into the exhibit text stimulating thought about such questions as:

- ✎ What beliefs are worth dying for?
- ✎ Why do good people torture and kill good people?
- ✎ Is the teaching of love one's enemy practical counsel?

The exhibit surrounds the viewer with the martyrs story. At the core of the exhibit are 12 martyr stories, told through enlarged photographs of *Martyrs Mirror* etchings that surround a central arena—the silent place of execution. The exhibit conveys a sense of drama as reflected in the sub-title of the *Martyrs Mirror*—*The Bloody Theater of Nonresistant Christians*.
